The species was first recorded in Algeria, and has been described as a typically pale-coloured insect of the desert. It has always been considered to be endemic to the Maghreb, until its occurrence also in trans-Saharan Ghana was recently recorded. Its relationship to other Holarctic *Enallagma* taxa is the subject of current molecular studies.
